OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD



The mission of Operation Christmas Child (OCC) is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to needy children around the world, and together with the local church worldwide, to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. OCC brings joy and hope to children in desperate situations worldwide through gift-filled shoe boxes and the Good News of God's love. Our church participates in collecting shoeboxes for distribution!

Each shoebox should contain these supplies to fill the shoeboxes for three ages of Boys or Girls — 2-4, 5-9, and 10-14.

A "Wow" Item — Doll, stuffed animal, soccer ball w/air pump, etc.

Personal care items — Toothbrush, bar soap, comb, hairbrush, washcloth, fingernail clipper, nail file, hair scrunchies, etc.

Clothing and Accessories — Socks, flip-flops, hat-scarf-mittens, tote bag/purse, sunglasses, etc.

Craft and Activities — Pencils w/sharpeners, crayons, markers, glue sticks, small writing pads, calculators, flashcards, stickers, mini-sewing kit, etc.

Toys — Mini cars, Slinky, yo-yo's, kazoos, puzzles, small balls, jump ropes, finger puppets, etc. (**No war related items!**)

A Personal Note — A short note with picture as desired!

Do Not Include

Candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks ; drink mixes (powered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

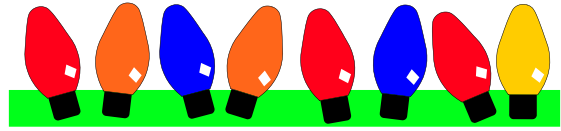
